

Highlights of the NLC Survey Findings*

Background

66,054 nurses licensed across five states – Alaska, Kansas, Minnesota, Nevada and Vermont – participated in the online surveys. Kansas and Vermont subsequently enacted the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC).

Almost half (45%) of surveyed nurses provided nursing services or communicated with a patient or client across state borders in the past two years, a 10% increase from the previous survey.


44% of respondents held an active nursing license in at least one other state, a 6% increase from the previous survey.



of **nurses** who practiced under a multistate license believe it to be **beneficial** to their work.

Benefits of a multistate license:

- Facilitates cross-border nursing practice and telehealth
- Greater access to care for patients
- Simplifies applying for and maintaining licenses, and makes the process less expensive
- Supports military families as they relocate
- Offers new employment opportunities
